<p>2:00-3:30 p.m.</p>	<p>50th Reunion Program: Polarization, Politicization, and the Courts</p> <p>In the next few weeks, the Supreme Court will be issuing consequential decisions involving reproductive rights, gun control, the fundamental workings of the federal government, and criminal proceedings against a Presidential candidate. At the same time, public confidence in the courts, and particularly the U.S. Supreme Court, has fallen dramatically (although it still exceeds that of Congress). Are the polarizing forces we see at work in the political arena also changing the role of the federal and state courts, which we used to view as less “political”? Are we seeing the end of the independent judiciary? Or, as some on both the right and left believe, have the courts always been simply another forum for bareknuckle politics?</p> <p>Our panel will begin with a review of the historical context of the Framers' aspirations of an independent judiciary and its importance to a functioning democracy. We will then turn to a broader, interactive discussion of the current state of the American courts, federal and state, including a look at several upcoming Supreme Court decisions. Classmates Susan Richard Nelson, Tom Balmer, and Donn Ginoza will bring their deep experience in the judicial and executive branches to this critical topic.
